ABOUT THE TURRELL FUND

Vision and Mission

Societal Vision

That need will be eliminated as a barrier to the access of quality educational and developmental experiences by all children, and especially the youngest and their families, so that they may be prepared for academic and life success.

Organizational Vision

That access to quality educational and developmental opportunities will be assured for the children of the Turrell Fund's served areas, with an emphasis on the youngest, at-risk children and their families.

Organizational Mission

To financially and strategically support organizations which directly provide or foster the creation and delivery of quality developmental and educational services to at-risk children, especially the youngest and their families, in Vermont and designated areas of New Jersey.

History

The Turrell Fund was founded in 1935 by Herbert and Margaret Turrell. Herbert Turrell, a man burdened with an underprivileged childhood, a broken home and near-poverty translated his misfortune into devoted sympathy with and service to all young people facing challenges. The Turrells felt that the most important use for their wealth would be to give at-risk children the basic elements for success in life.

Turrell Today

Our priority is organizations serving young children ages zero to five which can present strong evidence of exceptional service quality and who have distinguished themselves along multiple dimensions. While we continue to fund direct services, times have changed and many parents are in the workforce. We

fund policy change because we recognize the importance of the early years and access to high-quality childcare.

Turrell Fund grants are awarded primarily to organizations located in Essex, Hudson, Passaic and Union Counties in New Jersey, and throughout the State of Vermont. In our grant decisions, the at-risk profile of the children served, and the ultimate reach and impact of our potential investments, are primary criteria.

Gifts and Bequests

The Turrell Fund accepts gifts and bequests in furtherance of the work described in our Vision and Mission Statements. We reserve the right to decline any gift which carries with it requirements that are not fully consisted with our stated purposes.

THOUGHTS FROM THE TURRELL TEAM

The Annual Report allows the Turrell Fund to reflect on its mission, vision, and approach. With reflection comes the ability to change and grow based on the needs of our clients, an important priority in the eyes of the Turrell Fund staff.

By learning from the challenges and successes of this past year, we can determine new and creative ways to serve children and families in New Jersey and Vermont. As we expand our reach and build new partnerships, we will continue to cultivate the client-service mentality that helps us build strong, meaningful connections. Only by avoiding the pitfall of "funder hubris" and partnering with all of you can we improve the systems that serve children and families.

We also recognize our work exists in the context of poverty, racism, and socioeconomic inequality. We cannot blame and shame families when so many barriers exist between them and their goals. These barriers include, but are not limited to: lack of affordable housing; food insecurity; inaccessible health care; and a dearth of high-quality, affordable child care.

At the Turrell Fund, we don't turn away from those in need. Given the hard work that providers, practitioners, and advocates are doing in New Jersey and Vermont, it is our mandate to support your efforts using every resource at the Turrell Fund's disposal. Doing this keeps us in line with the vision that Herbert and Margaret Turrell had for the Fund back in 1935.

After an exciting year, it is my pleasure to reflect on a number of important milestones from 2019 and look to the future.

Developing a True Partnership Model of Philanthropy

The Turrell Fund is a foundation that offers support and partnership beyond the grant. We know we don't have all the answers, and we are committed to working with those directly serving children and families to achieve concrete, sustainable impact.

Over the course of 2019, our staff has offered free professional development sessions, workshops on financial responsibility, and brainstorming meetings to help nonprofits with whatever challenge they are facing.

We are also proud of the 2019 Turrell Fund Day for Children in Vermont. At this landmark event, Dr. Junlei Li, Saul Zaentz senior lecturer in early childhood education at the Harvard Graduate School of Education, shared his research on supporting the work of helpers—those who serve children and families on the frontlines of education and social services. His remarks resonated with our client base in ways we couldn't have imagined, and his ideas continue to spread and inspire.

In addition, back in April we welcomed our Vermont grantee Young Tradition Vermont to share their special brand of traditional Vermont folk music and dance. YTV consists of 27 teen players, singers and dancers who are internationally renowned. They embarked on an exhilarating New Jersey and New York City performance and musical exchange Tour, including numerous New Jersey partners.

Finally, we are dedicated to creating a Grantee Support Network, a web of skilled volunteers, experts, and services for our clients. Whether support is needed around fundraising, grant writing, accounting, communications, etc., we hope to be able to connect our clients with valuable and timely support.

In addition, we will be revamping our website, in part to share these resources more broadly. This, coupled with an expanded social media presence, will make us more accessible than ever. The Turrell Fund can be found on Twitter (@TurrellFund).

<u>Improving the Systems and Policies that Serve Children and Families</u>

While the Turrell Fund provides vital, community-based nonprofits with direct support, there is also an understanding that long-term, large-scale impact depends on policy change. Thankfully, 2019 saw some big policy wins and multiple emerging projects.

In Vermont, Let's Grow Kids (LGK) has partnered with numerous organizations to achieve great progress on the issue of high-quality, affordable, accessible child care. Today, 72% of child care programs have received a high rating (3-5 stars) through Vermont's quality rating and improvement system. In June 2011, only 28% of child care programs hit this mark. In addition, LGK's message has resonated throughout the state house, Vermont's business sector, and the national early childhood landscape at large.

We are also proud to support the Vermont Early Childhood Advocacy Alliance (the Alliance), which applies a model of strategic and compassionate support for early childhood nonprofits. By ensuring its partners know how to advocate for and protect vital funding, the Alliance strengthens the early childhood ecosystem and protects gains from initiatives like Let's Grow Kids.

In the Garden State, we are taking the Right from the Start NJ (RFSTNJ) campaign to the next level in partnership with the Nicholson Foundation, Advocates for Children of New Jersey (ACNJ), and Caucus Education Corporation. We will be bringing in a strategic marketing firm and polling organization, allowing us to use targeted messaging to communicate the importance of the early years to an even wider audience. And luckily, we have some big wins to build on.

In September of 2019, Ceil Zalkind of ACNJ shared that the New Jersey Department of Human Services increased funding for child care by \$54 million. This money went to an increase in child care subsidy rates, improving quality, and creating more access to infant-toddler care. This win was only possible through the efforts of many dedicated organizations. We thank you, and urge you visit the RFTSNJ website if you'd like to learn more: http://www.rightfromthestartnj.org.

Finally, we are proud of our collaboration with the Burke Foundation and Nicholson Foundation on scaling the Healthy Steps program. This program of ZERO TO THREE embeds an early childhood specialist into pediatric care teams, and Hackensack Meridian Health has agreed to implement at three sites. The project has launched, and it's our belief that this compassionate, evidence-backed model of care will spread through entire health systems and achieve meaningful, sustainable change.

Nurturing Resilience in Families and Children: Addressing Trauma New Jersey

In 2018, the Turrell Fund helped form the New Jersey ACEs Funders Collaborative (The Collaborative) with the Burke Foundation and the Nicholson Foundation. The Collaborative will support programs for families who have experienced, or are at risk of, adverse childhood experiences (ACEs).

Several important milestones were achieved in 2019. Focus groups were conducted and two ACEs Labs (brainstorming sessions) were held in north and south New Jersey. The turnout, enthusiasm, and ideas were inspiring. For next steps, the Collaborative is now looking to have tangible, direct impact on the lives of children and families.

At the Turrell Fund, we are committed to concrete impact and driven by respect for experts in the field. We have been convening some of our grantees who work on issues of trauma to discuss (1) how they do their work and (2) what they need to support their efforts. Our clients agree that trauma-focused work must be compassionate, non-prescriptive, and non-stigmatizing, and that the only way to approach this work is in a strengths-based manner.

We fully understand that it is you, our clients, who are the true champions in this work. We are here to listen and hope to be of service.

Conclusion

Our society does not provide pathways and opportunities for all children and families. Even after all this time, we are plagued by inequities stemming from greed, racism, and apathy. Some have lost the imagination they had as a child. The ability to believe in a better world.

We do not lack for imagination here at the Turrell Fund, and we know the same is true for all of you.

We strive to be additive rather than prescriptive, concrete rather than esoteric, and transparent rather than cryptic. We want people doing great work to know that they have a home at Van Vleck Manor. Here, you will find a team of tireless advocates prepared to drop everything and lend a helping hand.

Thank you for your partnership and support. And know that we are always here to listen, partner, and fight alongside you for a better world.

It's what our children, and all people, deserve.

- A voice in the chorus of those speaking to educational policy change
- Initiatives directed at systems and policy change
